Recap: WLO - United Nations High Level Political Forum 2024 Webinar on "Leisure as a Catalyst: Empowering Communities and Alleviating Poverty"

On July 16, 2024, the World Leisure Organization (WLO) hosted a significant side event during the United Nations High Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development. The webinar, titled "Leisure as a Catalyst: Empowering Communities and Alleviating Poverty," brought together experts to discuss the vital role of leisure in achieving the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The event, held under the auspices of the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations (ECOSOC), featured a distinguished panel including:

- Rasul Mowatt (North Carolina State University, United States) representing WLO
- Jackie Oncescu (University of New Brunswick, Canada) from the Canadian Association of Leisure Studies

- Erwei Dong (New York University and The University of The Ryukyus, United States) from the China-International Leisure Research Association
- Bailey Ashton Adie (University of Oulu, Finland) from the Leisure Studies Association
- Lauren Nicole Duffy (Clemson University, United States) from The Academy of Leisure Sciences

Moderated by **Joanne Schroeder**, Chair of WLO and affiliated with Vancouver Island University, the discussion highlighted how leisure can be a powerful tool for community empowerment and poverty alleviation. The panelists shared insights and strategies on integrating leisure into global development policies, emphasizing its importance in fostering inclusive and sustainable growth.

The webinar attracted a global audience, reflecting the increasing recognition of leisure as a key component in sustainable development efforts. OECD Policy Brief: Leveraging

Large-scale culture, sports and business events can create jobs, support local businesses, raise the profile of places and improve the health and wellbeing of citizens. Having recently cohosted the ICC Men's T20 World Cup, the U.S. is now gearing up to host the Olympic and Paralympic Games in 2028, as well as co-hosting the Men's FIFA World Cup in 2026. These events will bring thousands of spectators and have the opportunity to generate economic returns for the host cities and surrounding areas. At the same time, the U.S. regularly hosts many largescale cultural events, such as the Sundance Film Festival, Burning Man, Coachella, and SXSW. But what can host cities do to capture the long-term benefits of these events? And how can cities and regions not hosting such high-profile festivals and tournaments, still use culture, sports and business events as a lever of economic and social development? This policy brief focuses on how state, county and local governments across the U.S. can leverage culture, sports and business events for local development. It focuses on five main topics: skills and employment; business development, trade, and investment; social inclusion and participation; tourism and placemaking; and measuring impact at the local level.

6th Brazilian Congress on Leisure Studies


